No. X had no record deal when he made it, and the song bubbled up on the internet before it made three different Billboard charts: the Hot 100, the Billboard Hot Songs and the Country Songs. . . . Released in 1996 on Mercury Nashville Records, the album produced three hit singles on the Billboard Hot Country Singles Tracks charts: "Achy Lacks", "High Low and In Between", and "Plan on Your Best", which peaked at 6, 11, and 5, respectively.

Somebody Said a Prayer was released as the album's lead-off single, and was a top 40 hit on the country charts in late 2008. Originally planned to be released in July 2004, the album was pushed to new release dates five times.

The title track and "A Good Day Followed" as the second and third singles, reaching number 47 and number 76, respectively. The album peaked at number 41 on the Billboard Independent Albums Chart, Change My Mind Billy Ray Cyrus Change My Mind is the thirteenth studio album by country singer Billy Ray Cyrus, and his first re-own record label Blue Cadillac Music. The album's title song is a cover of a song written by songwriter Bob McDowell and originally recorded by Jackie Newton in 1981, in 1983 by the Nitty Gritty Dirt Band, and a number 77 peaking single in 1990 for Jennifer McCrewe and The McCanns. Records Nashville, the album produced three chart singles for Brock on the Billboard Hot Country Singles Tracks charts in 1995, while "The Car" and "Holla on to Sometimes" were both Top Ten hits in 1996, at 16 and 15th.
